

FACULTY OF THE LONDON INSTITUTE OF SPACE POLICY AND LAW  
MEMBERSHIP TERMS AND CONDITIONSCOMMITMENT:

Subject to the availability of the Faculty member, each Faculty member shall be willing to undertake or assist with one or more of the following: teaching courses or seminars, conducting or supervising research, providing material for publication, proposing projects, programme development, and attracting students, including course preparation and written material, grading, student assessment, and timely reporting to the Institute. Where possible, each Faculty member shall assist in promoting and in attracting funding for the Institute.

Faculty members should endeavour to provide their part-time teaching, research and other academic services through the Institute.

QUALIFICATION:

Members of the Faculty shall have expertise in space policy or law or in a field relevant or related to the mission of the Institute to advance and disseminate knowledge about the policies and laws governing space, for the benefit of the public. Their qualifications shall be at the level appropriate to the activity conducted and, where relevant, required by a collaborating institution.

TENURE OF APPOINTMENT:

Membership of the Faculty shall be for a four-year automatically renewable term. For this purpose, each year shall be reckoned to run from 1 January closest to the date of appointment. The Faculty member or the Institute may terminate the term for cause or on reasonable notice.

RESPONSIBILITIES AND BENEFITS:

In conducting research or teaching, Faculty members must comply with the Institute Code of Conduct, high ethical and professional standards and with other requirements specific to a particular activity.

Only individuals with authority delegated in writing by the Director or an appropriate Institute official may represent the Institute or enter into any commitments on behalf of the Institute. Institute resources, including those made available by other organisations, must be reserved for business purposes of the Institute. They may not be used without the Director's authorisation or for personal gain or personal use except incidental to and reasonable in light of the individual's duties.

Faculty members shall be entitled to Institute publications, to attend seminars and events, and to cite their affiliation with the Institute on their publicity or other materials for the duration of their appointment, and shall be listed on the Institute's website and other material. On any reasonable occasion, Faculty members shall make known their membership of the Institute Faculty, including in biographies, credits for contributions to conferences and publications on space related topics.

Each remunerated activity undertaken by a Faculty member will be governed by the terms of a specific contract, which will cover any remuneration, duties, obligations and duration of the activity. In directing any pre-existing or other work through the Institute, the Institute shall secure to the Faculty member doing so, the same remuneration as the member would otherwise have received.
